


SESSION HIGHLIGHTS **January 11, 2024**

The meeting was called to order in the pastor's study at 4:00 p.m. CST. The moderator opened the meeting with prayer and devotion. Suzanne Jordan, Kristi Slaby, Julie Williams, and Donna Wood were present. Linda Comingore an Kathy O'Neall were absent. Clerk declared a quorum.

Items discussed and actions taken by Session included:

- Pastor Bartel reported on Officer training for Elders; e-mail voting procedures; January 21st Manse Open House; update on 2024 committee schedules; congregational meeting agenda; and Personnel Committee search. The weather cancellation policy was reviewed.
- Correspondence received: Thank You from Presbyterian Ministry Engagement and Support, Disaster Relief for donation.
- The Treasurer's report was accepted.
- A request from Prairie Arts Council for use of church for art awards programs on 1/28, 2/18, and 3/10 was voted on and accepted.



- Continued discussion on Church Directory update.
- Voted to collect four special offerings in 2024: One Great Hour of Sharing (Easter), Pentecost (May 19, World Communion/Peace Offering (October 6), and Christmas Joy Offering (December).
- Property report included streaming problem solved; lamp bulb in sanctuary projector was replaced; committee helped Worship and Music Committee decorate the sanctuary; and a leak in kitchen sink has been fixed.
- Voted to serve Communion the first Sunday of each month, Easter, and Christmas Eve.

Session agreed to hold the next meeting on Thursday, February 8 at 4:00 p.m. CDT. The meeting was adjourned with prayer at 5:31 p.m.



On the third Saturday of each month, Vanessa and Rob Jefferson open the Good Samaritan Food Pantry for any customers needing assistance. Volunteers to help serve the clients are always welcome! Food insecurity continues to be a problem in our area.

Vanessa reported four families were served, including five adults and eight children, on the third Saturday in January.

I wanted to share this poem with you this month as we anticipate spring.

Gerard Manley Hopkins was, to put it mildly, an interesting guy. He was raised in the high church tradition of Anglicans in the second half of the 19th century and eventually became a Jesuit priest. In addition to poetry, he was a trained visual artist, and he taught in various school settings. It's commonly believed that he dealt with depression.

What I so like about his poetry is the way he plays with words. If you read it out loud, you'll notice that the words he chooses create sounds that echo what he's writing about. This poem was the one that taught me the word "pied:" basically, multi-colored. (Bonus: "pied" is sometimes the answer for crossword clues.)


