

For reflection:

Can you identify with the leper was cleansed and then returned to praise Jesus? What about this person is familiar to you?

Imagine running down the road to catch up with Jesus and praise and worship him: what would you be thanking God for?

Most of us, most of the time, do not feel entirely whole. We may feel that something is missing or broken. If you could call out to Jesus right now, what would you ask him to heal in you?

Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. – Philippians 4:6 "We have to be braver than we think we can be, because God is constantly calling us to be more than we are."
